

## **“OFCA Slackline” Regulations**

In order to ensure the safety of the Participants of the event, we hereby introduce these Regulations (hereinafter referred to as: the “**Regulations**”), worded as follows:

1. The Regulations, issued by the Organizer, i.e. by the “OFCA Foundation” based at ul. Sejmowa 1/5, 56-400 Oleśnica, KRS 559954, NIP 9112010907 (hereinafter referred to as: the “**Organizer**”), refer to “OFCA Slackline” which will take place on 9-11 August 2019 in Oleśnica as a part of “Oleśnica's Festival of Circus and Art” (**OFCA Festival**).
2. Participation in the OFCA Slackline is only possible for adults with slackline experience (hereinafter referred to as the “**Participant**”). Minors are not allowed to participate in the OFCA Slackline.
3. Participation in the OFCA Slackline is charged and costs **70 PLN**. It is a fee per one person, for the whole Festival. The fee for OFCA includes overnight accommodation at the campsite on **8-12 August 2019**. The Organizer does not provide for any discounts related neither to shorter than maximum available participation in the OFCA Slackline nor to non-use of the OFCA Campsite.
4. Signing Slackline Declaration and paying the entry fee provides each Participant with unlimited access to all tapes at OFCA Slackline: highline and waterline (if suspended).
5. Each Participant of the OFCA Slackline must wear wristband. The wristbands are obtained at the Registration point after paying a fee and signing a statement on getting acquainted with the OFCA Slackline Regulations and OFCA Campsite Regulations. The wristband must be put on the participant's hand by the Organizer's staff member.
6. The Organizer reserves the right to verify information given by the Participant and, in case of providing false information, to refuse his participation in the OFCA Slackline. The Organizer may also exclude the Participant from the OFCA Slackline when the Participant's behaviour poses a threat to his or other people's safety or disrupts the course of the OFCA Festival.
7. By declaring the participation in the OFCA Slackline, the Participant bears full responsibility for his actions, including his own health, life and damages caused by him, both material and non-material, including to third parties during the organization and duration of the event.
8. The Organizer is not liable for any damage or damage to health caused by the Participant or that may result from his participation in the OFCA Slackline both toward the participant and third parties. This liability is charged entirely by the Participant.
9. In case of disputes, the ultimate decision is made by the Organizer, whose vote is final.
10. The OFCA Slackline takes place on lines prepared and secured by designated and suitably qualified persons with appropriate permissions.
11. To enter the highline the Participant must have his own climbing harness. The harness must have appropriate certificates (CE for PPE, UIAA), as well as markings (manufacturer, date of manufacture, serial number). The above mentioned equipment must be in good technical condition. If the equipment does not meet the specified requirements or its expiration date has passed, it cannot be used. The Participant is fully responsible for the equipment efficiency.
12. The Organizer reserves the right to verify the equipment i.e. he may carry out random inspections by a qualified person. An authorized person has the right to refuse to use the equipment which does not meet the specified requirements.
13. The participant may enter the highline tape only in the presence of an authorized person from the company specialized in working at height. Entry is possible after checking the Participant's harness by an authorized person. The authorized person checks technical condition of the highline itself, participant's harness and the method of attaching the harness to the lunge.
14. The Participant may perform a manoeuvre of standing up (e.g. 'chongo start') only in the designated place, i.e. behind the colored tag on the tape. The tag specifies a safe distance from the building structure. It is strictly forbidden to make a standing start from the building structure before such marker. When climbing back onto the highline, the Participant must not touch the façade of the building. A manoeuvre of stepping onto a highline after previous fall off may only take place with the aid of a lunge and the Participant is expected to know this technique.
15. The Participant is recommended to wear appropriate protective clothing for the highline (long trousers, gloves and a long-sleeved shirt). It is not mandatory, but not having such clothing may lead to minor injuries (such as abrasions, bruises, cuts) for which the Participant is fully responsible.

16. It is forbidden to wear or use any sharp or pointed objects that may cause partial or complete failure of the Participant's safety equipment (any element of the highline system, lunge or Participant's harness).
17. When stepping on a line, it is forbidden to carry any items which could fall and pose risk to people and vehicles in the vicinity (e.g. a wallet, a phone, keys, etc.). Cameras must have their own lunge.
18. The only acceptable form of highline safety measure is a harness with a lunge.
19. The Participants have the right to stay in highline areas only in officially designated hours and only under authorized persons' supervision. It is forbidden to make any changes to the tape mounting systems. In case of a need for tightening of one of the highlines or another technical fix, it should be reported to the company specialized in working at height.
20. The Participants may move in buildings intended for part of the highline only in designated places - marked with arrows. The Participants should use only marked emergency entrances. It is strictly forbidden to enter unmarked rooms or to enter a tape from unauthorized windows or passages. Any damage to the building interiors, façades or other elements of the building will result in removal from the festival and a fine equal to the value of the damage caused.
21. The Participants use highline and waterline on their own risk and bear full responsibility for injuries, material and non-material damage caused to themselves or others.
22. The Organizer is not responsible for the Participant who uses the highline or waterline under the influence of alcohol or other intoxicants.
23. Waterline participants may use lines on their own responsibility, provided they are able to swim. The Organizer is not responsible for the safety of the Participants staying in the water.
24. By declaring participation in OFCA Slackline the Participant confirms that he's familiar with the provisions of these Regulations and accept them.
25. The Organizer is not responsible for the equipment left at any Festival venue.
